Nicholas Onsomu

- Witchcraft is a big problem within the Kisii community; at a Christian's funeral I taught about diabetes and emphasized how Christians should not fear witchcraft because a Christian cannot be bewitched (people thought the man died of diabetes because he was bewitched)
- The church was started at Egetonto (4 kilometers from Nyamatuta) when eight souls accepted Christ in baptism

Mombasa

- An encounter with a man in a café led to his conversion and conversions in his congregation which became the Church of Christ Tudor
- Our Sunday service is conducted live at Baraka FM from 8:00-10:00 a.m.
- We responded to our listeners' desires for time to ask questions, talk personally about life's issues, and request prayer; a "kesha" radio program now airs at midnight to 5:00 a.m. on Saturday morning
- A Muslim woman was baptized at the Miritini Church
